

Let's talk about RACE: What is it? Where does it come from?

From John Biewen, a storyteller, historian, and public radio veteran:

Let's look at racism a little differently ---- NOT through the experience of the people on the receiving end, but by examining those of us whose ancestors built this contraption, this white supremacist dream. These reflections are for those of us conditioned not to see whiteness, even as we accept its advantages as our birthright. We set out to get better at seeing the water we're all swimming in.

The Interfaith Alliance is composed of many congregations that are predominately White --- probably even more White than metro Portland. In thinking about examining race and racism this fall, we wanted to look inward to delve into the topic, not look outward to see race and racism "elsewhere". Biewen's audio podcast series, "Seeing White," fits the requirement perfectly.

Now, to our non-White brethren: Please join us! Your perspectives(s) will be valuable! You may be encouraged by the podcast commentary from Chenjerai Kumanyika, John Biewen's co-presenter.

The Listening & Discussion Group will be like a self-led book club --- participants will listen to an assigned podcast in advance and bring their thoughts, reactions, concerns, questions to the open forum for discussion. (We will break into random groups of 5-6 if group size suggests it.) There is no intended intellectual or political "end point" to this series, except perhaps a different "take" on our American history, our American institutions, and thoughts about how we White people might understand that the race issue in America is of OUR making. What are we going to do about it? --- anything?
